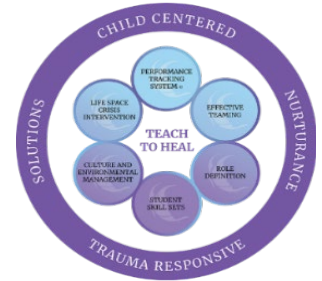

Why Attend

- Let's be honest. The **last two years have been demanding, challenging, and tough.**
- These sessions will provide clarification of **our roles in supporting ourselves and students.**
- According to the National Center for Mental Health Promotion and Youth Violence Prevention **25% to 30% of youth experience trauma.**
- That number **has likely increased** due to numerous, sudden and drastic changes – bringing mental stress, loss and turmoil into our lives
- **We must understand** that in adult-managed places, like schools, there are youth who do not trust the guidance of adults. This is not because of anything the school staff have created.
- **We must be aware** and solution focused.
- **We must teach adults** how to make necessary adjustments.
- **We must have a systemic team plan.**

Who should attend: School Leadership Teams including administrators, school counselors, behavioral interventionists, social workers, school psychologists, teachers, health workers, community liaisons.

Part 1: Teach to Heal: Foundation & Recovery September 26, 2022

In order for schools to become Trauma Responsive, they must first comprehend the true impact that trauma has on children's ability to be responsive to adult managed places and learning environments. *Teach to Heal's Foundational* training will cover these components to set the stage for the remainder of the series. *Teach to Heal's Recovery* training will focus on the impact of the last two years of events and how our educational leaders, including school counselors, should plan to support professionals, student support staff, and our students.

Part 2 & 3: Teach to Heal: Role Definition & Culture and Environmental Management

September 27, 2022 (Pre-requisite Part 1)

As schools move toward Trauma Responsive Strategies they must provide clarity around role definition. This sounds easier than it is. *Teach to Heal's Role Definition and Culture and Environmental Management* training focuses on the imperative nature of clear role definition in our schools. We will also focus on what must be in place in our systems to establish and maintain cultures that foster what is necessary to meet the needs of ALL our students. In addition, we will define how to utilize the learning environment as an instructional tool to maximize student engagement and progress.

Part 4: Teach to Heal: Setting the Interdependent Table

February 6, 2023 (Face to Face) Virtual Snow Date is Feb 27, 2023, if needed (Pre-requisite Part 2 & 3)

This day of learning will allow us the opportunity to review and discuss implementation thus far. We will share our challenges and talk about how to move forward. This is the most critical discussion we have as educators. Our kids and the success of our schools depends on it.
